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

# 管風琴帶我去月球

#### 曲目介紹

巴赫:G 大調前奏曲與賦格,作品 541

本場音樂會搭配中秋節,管風琴家特別用「月亮」當主題,將多首曲子改編為管風琴曲。開場曲先帶來經典的巴赫《G 大調前奏曲與賦格》作品 541,此曲運用重複不斷的 16 分音符,呈現出熱情激昂的歡快節奏,彷彿像是幫觀眾「暖機」登月火箭的引擎一般,開啟了今日的登月序幕。緊接著是美國作曲家蓋西文的《去月球》,此曲發表於 1919 年,歌詞內容鼓吹「地球人們」不妨移居月球,在那可以感受到真正的自由與快樂,想像力十足。經典電影《第凡內早餐》裡,知名演員奧黛莉赫本拿著吉他坐在窗台上自彈自唱《月河》,清新脫俗的美麗深深吸引觀眾,也讓曼西尼的這首創作,成為影史上最具代表性的月亮名曲。另一首由蓋西文創作的《某人守護著我》,呢喃唱出尋求愛情的渴望,「守護」的意象也彷彿月亮一般,成為爵士樂界最受歡迎的經典必備歌曲。

至於西方歌劇界與「月亮」有直接相關的曲子,意外地並不算太多,捷克作曲家德弗札克 的《月之頌》應是最切題的詠嘆調,描述了身為水妖的女主角暗戀人類王子,只能對著月 亮唱出愛意的孤單心情。

本場音樂會終曲將帶來法國作曲家維耶爾恩的觸技曲作品 56 第 6 首,充滿著 16 分音符的快速音群,與開場的巴赫曲目遙相呼應,也彷彿帶領著觀眾搭上返回地球的太空船,結束這趟透過管風琴神遊的登月之旅!

In celebration of Mid-Autumn Festival, a concert all about the moon is in store with pieces rearranged for the organ. It starts with the joyful Prelude and Fugue in G Major by BACH, a continuous stream of 16th notes warming up the audience for liftoff! Following is GERSHWIN's *Come to the Moon*, which debuted in 1919, the artist's fun attempt at persuading Earthlings to move to the moon to enjoy true freedom and happiness. In *Breakfast at Tiffany's*, Audrey HEPBURN captivatingly sings and plays Henry MANCINI's *Moon River* at the window on her guitar, making this the most iconic moon-related song in film history. Another GERSHWIN piece and hit jazz classic, *Someone to Watch over Me*, is about a search for love, just as the moon watches over the night sky. The most famous classical piece about the moon is DEBUSSY's "Clair de lune." Inspired by Symbolist poet Paul-Marie VERLAINE's poem by the same name, it describes people adorned in fancy masks dancing under the moon. Bart HOWARD's classic jazz piece *Fly Me to the Moon* became a hit after Frank SINATRA's 1964 recording. The first astronauts to walk on the moon even played it on their trip to the lunar surface!

Taiwan's most renowned piece on the moon (and the most widely circulated Mandarin song ever) is WENG Ching-hsi's *The Moon Represents My Heart*, which debuted in a 1973 CHEN Fen-lan album and surged to fame with Teresa TENG's 1977 cover, the candid lyrics brimming with romance.

Surprisingly few Western operas directly reference the moon. DVOŘÁK's *Song to the Moon* is an aria in which a water nymph sings longingly to the moon about her secret love for a human prince. Finally, we are shuttled back to Earth by French composer VIERNE's Toccata, Op. 53 No. 6. Full of 16th notes, it ties back into the first piece by BACH, bringing our organ-inspired lunar walk to an end!
